Observation of 115th Death Anniversary of Sahid Khudiram Bose Date – 11.08.2023

The department of History of Mugberia Gangadhar Mahavidyalaya has organized 115th death anniversary of Khudiram Bose (1889 – 1908) on 11th August 2023 at room number 103. He was an Indian revolutionary and freedom fighter who played a significant role in the Indian independence movement against British colonial rule. He is remembered for his courageous actions and sacrifices in the pursuit of India's freedom.

Khudiram Bose was born in Habibpur, in the Midnapore district of West Bengal, India. He became actively involved in the freedom movement from a young age and was inspired by the ideals of other revolutionary leaders like Bipin Chandra Pal, Aurobindo Ghosh, and Sri Aurobindo.

One of the most notable incidents associated with Khudiram Bose is the Muzaffarpur bombing. 
