Examination Rules

1. A candidate shall have to secure 40% marks in both External and Internal Assessment of each Theoretical paper (Course/Half) as well as in Practical paper in each course as qualifying marks and 50 % marks in each course as pass marks.
2. A candidate who fails to secure 50% marks in one or two Courses/Halves shall be declared as 'Supplementary'. A candidate who fails to secure 50% marks in more than two Courses/Halves in a semester shall be declared as failed in that semester. He/she shall have to appear at the whole semester as the Supplementary Examination either along with the next higher semester or with the next regular batch.
3. A back candidate shall have to clear his/her back Courses/Halves within two more consecutive chances, such that he/she shall clear his/her B.Ed./M.Ed. Programme within three years from his/her date of admission. In no way, any candidate will get more than three consecutive chances to qualify any particular semester examination. If any candidate does not enrol or appear at any Semester Examination, he/she shall be deemed to have lost one chance.
4. A candidate who secures the Grade 'E' and above and wants to repeat any theoretical paper(s) to improve his/her performance in any Course/Half shall be allowed to surrender his/her earlier grade(s) in the theoretical paper(s) within 15 days of the date of publication of result. He/she will have to appear at the next Supplementary Examination for repeating the theoretical paper(s). His/her repeat performance in the course(s) will be taken into consideration to compute the SGPA and CGPA.
5. If a candidate is not satisfied with the result of any theoretical paper (Course/Half), he/she may apply to the Controller of Examinations for reviewing the respective paper (Course/Half) within 15 days of publication of result by depositing Rs. 200/- per theoretical paper (Course/Half). He/she may apply for maximum two theoretical papers (Courses/Halves).
